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Dear Prospective Adoptive Family,

Thank you for your interest in Generations Adoptions. Generations is a non-profit organization licensed by the State of Texas. Generations is located in Waco, Texas, and opened in July 2004. Our mission is to provide permanent Christian adoptive families for children in need; counseling and support services for women throughout their pregnancy; and Christian families for orphans from around the globe.

We encourage you to read the following information prayerfully as you consider your possible adoption journey. We hope that this information will answer many of your questions about our agency. Birth parent(s) seek our services because of our ministry to birthmothers as well as our commitment to place their children with Christian families whose lives are an evident expression of their love of Christ.

After prayerful consideration, if it is your joint opinion that you meet the qualifications as an adoptive couple with Generations Adoptions, and would like to further pursue domestic infant adoption through our agency, please complete the enclosed Adoptive Family Pre-Application. If you have questions about meeting any of the eligibility requirements, please call first and speak to one of our staff before completing the pre-application. Upon receipt of it, we will review your pre-application and you will be invited to an orientation (three hours) at our office.

At times, openings in our domestic adoption program are limited and thus, we must take into account the composition of existing approved and waiting adoptive families when making the decisions of which families to accept. After completion of the orientation, prospective couples meeting the above criteria will be invited to attend the next Adoptive Parent Education Class (six hours) held on a Saturday several times a year.

Should God lead you to adopt through Generations, we will commit to pray for you, and with you, as God leads you in your journey of adoption.

Eligibility Requirements for Adopting through Generations Adoptions

- 1. The adoptive couple must be a legally married husband and wife who have a stable marriage. The adoptive couple must be married for a minimum of three years. In the event of essential need and the best interests of the child the admissions committee can waive the three year requirement.** *Our birth parents are usually single mothers who have decided to place for adoption so their baby can have both a mother and a father who love each other and their future child. Couples who are hurting and/or lonely may wish to seek counseling before seeking to adopt a child of any age or condition. Marital maturity and stability is imperative to all concerned in the adoption process. It is important for the birth parent(s) to have the security of knowing that the adoptive couple's marriage has been proven with time. The child will also benefit from a stable marriage relationship.*
- 2. The adoptive couple needs to each be professing Christians and members of the same church affiliation within the limits of traditional Christianity. Generations is a Christian agency and our main criteria is to place children into Christian families.** *Birth parent(s) seek the adoption services of Generations Adoptions because they desire their child to be raised by Christians who have committed their lives fully to Jesus Christ.*
- 3. The age of the adoptive parents should be such that it could be reasonably expected for them to raise a child to maturity. Couples must have one partner between the age of 25 and 45 years of age. The remaining partner's age must be within five years outside of these parameters.**
- 4. The adoptive couple must commit to and acknowledge the importance of one partner being a "stay at home" parent, specifically during the initial six months until the finalization of consummation. This "stay at home" parent may work up to 20 hours per week outside the home, if necessary.**
- 5. The adoptive couple must submit a proof of employment and have a good employment record.**
- 6. The adoptive couple must be in good physical, mental, and emotional health.** *If health problems exist, they must be under control.*
- 7. The adoptive couple must be committed to affirming and acknowledging the brave decisions that the birthmothers have made to choose adoption over abortion.** *Nationwide, only 2% of pregnant women choose adoption as their answer to an unplanned pregnancy. Prospective adoptive parents must understand this and realize that these birthmothers who consider adoption as the best loving decision for their child are worthy of honor and respect.*
- 8. The adoptive couple needs to be financially secure.** *How much money a couple earns is not nearly as important as how well they manage what they have. Many times the birthmothers' decision for adoption is influenced by their lack of financial ability to raise their child.*
- 9. The adoptive couple must complete the "pre-application" and the "formal application."** *These are used as screening tools to ensure that the couple meets our criteria. The admissions committee makes the final decision on whether or not a couple is a "good fit" for our agency.*
- 10. The adoptive couple must attend one three (3) hour adoptive couple orientation on a weekday and one six (6) hour adoption education class on a Saturday.**
- 11. They must successfully complete an adoptive home study in accordance with Texas DPRS standards.** *Home visits will be scheduled during normal business hours. All family members are required to be present.*
- 12. Each couple must consent to Criminal History & Central Registry Background Check & FBI fingerprint check.**
- 13. The adoptive couple must be able to allow the child to receive generally accepted medical care and treatment (including life saving and invasive procedures) as recommended by competent licensed medical care providers.**
- 14. The Board reserves the right to accept or reject any applicant based upon what the Board determines is in the best interest of the mission of this agency.**

Mission

Generations Adoptions provides permanent Christian adoptive families for children in need; counseling and support services for women throughout their pregnancy; and Christian families for orphans from around the globe.

About The Children and Birth Parents

Most of the children we place for adoption in our domestic program are newborn infants. Since most of the planning is done before birth, we often do not know the sex of the baby. While families may choose to specify a gender, to date we have not had a family adopt that specific gender, so families must realize that being gender specific may limit our ability to show their profile to potential birthmothers. We anticipate that most of the children will be healthy, but there are never any certainties when it comes to health.

Special needs children will be served solely on the agency's ability to meet the needs of the child. The agency must have available adoptive families or reasonable expectations of finding adoptive parents prior to accepting a child for adoptive placement. Prayerful and careful effort will be made to guide the birth parent(s) in choosing an adoptive home that best fulfills the child's needs. Adoption placement decisions will not presume that placing a child in a family of the same race or ethnicity as the race or ethnicity of the child is in the best interest of the child.

There may be a rare occasion when an older child (four years of age or younger only) may be available for adoption with Generations, in the case of a birth parent who wishes to relinquish an older child; or relinquish her newborn infant and/or wishes to relinquish rights to their older child. We have placed one toddler for adoption to date.

The agency provides services to any woman experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. Our birth families are of various races, religions, and socioeconomic backgrounds. Our birth families usually live throughout the State of Texas and our caseworkers travel to meet with them, providing counseling and other support services throughout their pregnancy and after placement.

The Adoption Process

The first step is to gather *information*. You will have many questions that need to be answered and prayed through carefully. For instance: Are we ready for adoption? Where do we begin? What form of adoption do we prefer? Is it international, embryo, or domestic infant adoption? We will provide education on each of these types of adoptions at our orientation.

Admissions

In 2011, we had sixteen (16) placements of newborns into Christian families. We restrict admission to our program to those families that are especially compatible with our philosophy and meet our eligibility requirements. We also must consider the composition of existing approved and waiting adoptive families when making the decisions of which families to accept. We can not guarantee a child or an amount of waiting time. However, we do not require an exclusive relationship from you with our agency, and we have kept our initial costs low, so if you wish to also apply at another agency at the same time, you may. We do ask that you notify us if you are working with another agency, and if you adopt through another agency, so we can update your file. Because birthmothers choose families, we cannot guarantee a placement or the timing. The time a prospective adoptive family waits has varied from a few months to three (3) years. We believe that God connects families and placements will occur in His timing.

Procedures for Adoptive Parents

Married couples desiring to adopt from Generations Adoptions shall complete the following procedures:

1. If you have internet access, download the Information Packet from the agency's website. If you do not have internet access, write or call the agency for this information. Read the packet and determine if you meet the eligibility requirements.
2. If you think you meet the qualifications to adopt from Generations, then complete the enclosed pre-application and submit to the agency along with the \$100 fee due at this time. Upon review, prospective families will be invited to attend an orientation.
3. Attend the orientation (3 hour) at our office. The \$100 fee is payable at the orientation.
4. Complete and submit the formal application for review by the child-placing staff with \$300 assessment fee due at this time.
5. Attend one six (6) hour adoptive parent education class held on a Saturday in Waco.
6. Upon approval of formal application and completion of the six (6) hour class, schedule a home study with Generations, along with the FBI fingerprints and Criminal and Child Abuse background check. *Fee of \$1,000 *(plus mileage if over 30 miles; plus meals, and possibly lodging, if over 60 miles) is payable on the day of the home study visit.*
7. Final approval or disapproval from Admissions Committee (consists of the Executive Director, Child Placement Management Staff, and Case Worker). An approval fee of \$4,500 is due upon notice of approval.
8. Prepare a birthmom letter (called a profile) and submit ten color copies to agency after approved and approval fee is paid. Submit the information for the website also, if desired.
9. Prepare and submit a photo album to the agency. It will usually be shown at the match meeting but may be shown sooner. Be aware that the photo book will be given to the birthmother after placement.
10. Meet the birthparent(s) and possibly the extended birth family. At match the \$5,500 matching fee is due.
11. Prior to placement, pay the \$6,000 fee. Attend placement ceremony, if one is held, with birthparent(s) and possibly the extended birth family. Full payment of fees are to be paid before taking custody of the child.
12. Comply with 6 months of post placement supervision and comply with the level of openness agreement.
13. Attend finalization hearing.
14. Continue correspondence of letters, pictures, phone calls/emails, and visits as agreed upon.

All fees are non-refundable. In the case of an adoption that does not take place due to a birthmother choosing to parent, then all fees will apply to the next adoption through Generations Adoptions.

If there are special circumstances that require a family to withdraw temporarily or suspend their adoption, the Agency will apply 100% of the family's previously paid fees to the reactivated adoption if it takes place within two years of the withdrawal/ suspension. If more than six months have elapsed the family will need to comply with all fees at the then current rates.

Other Pertinent Information

Adoption Registries

Adoption registries were created for adults who want to search for their adopted child and for adopted persons who want to search for their birth family. The person who wants to search submits their names and any information they have regarding the person for whom they are searching. If the person they are searching for also submits information requesting a search, the two parties will be matched.

The Texas Department of Health – Bureau of Vital Statistics Central Adoption Registry is part of a voluntary mutual-consent registry system. It enables persons who are 18 years or older to list their name on the registry to locate other family members who are also listed. This is the only registry that has the authority to request a search of sealed or confidential records necessary to substantiate a match.

Many adoption agencies in Texas also maintain an adoption registry. Legal Guidelines in Adoption

The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services' sets the Minimum Standards for child-placing agencies with which we comply and formulate our policies. Most of the forms that must be signed are for legal purposes to meet requirements set in these standards. The Texas Family Code provides legal guidelines we follow throughout the adoption process.

Generations Adoptions has an attorney that we contract with who is very experienced in the field of adoptions and is available if you need legal advice. A fee may be incurred. Our attorney will be responsible for the legal proceedings of the termination phase of the adoption.

The adoption can be finalized after the child has been in the adoptive home for at least six (6) months. During this time the agency remains the Managing Conservator of the child, and, by state guidelines, must provide supervision of the child in the home.

A minimum of five (5) supervisory visits with the adopting parents are required within the first six months after placement. At two of the post placement visits all family members must be present. On occasion, visits may be scheduled in the agency office with at least one adoptive parent and the child present and/or may be made over the phone, if the caseworker and director approve.

Finalization of the adoption can take place after this post-placement supervision is complete. Our attorney will handle all the finalization procedures.

Legal Terminology Regarding Birth Parents

Relinquishment of Parental Rights:

- For the birth mother: She will sign a form called an “**Affidavit of Voluntary Relinquishment**.” This form states that she voluntarily relinquishes, or gives up, her rights to the child. This form can not be signed until after the baby is at least 48 hours old.
- For a birth father who is married to the birth mother: He will also sign a form called an “**Affidavit of Voluntary Relinquishment**.” This form states that he voluntarily relinquishes, or gives up, his parental rights. This form can not be signed until the baby is at least 48 hours old.

Waiver of Interest:

For a birth father who is not married to the birth mother, he may sign a “**Waiver of Interest**.” This form states that he *is not claiming* to be the father of the child, but that he waives, or gives up, any interest he may have in the child. He gives up any parental right to or responsibility for the child. Once he signs this form, his rights to the child are terminated. He may sign this form any time before or after the birth of the child.

Termination of Parental Rights:

According to the Texas law as of January 1, 2008 the legal definition of “parent” no longer includes the alleged biological birth father. An alleged biological birth father may assert his parental rights in only two ways. First, he may bring suit against the birth mother. Secondly, he may register with the Texas Paternity Registry (see below).

Paternity Registry Requirements:

The purpose of the Paternity Registry is to permit a man alleging to be the biological father of a child to assert his parentage, independent of the mother, and to preserve his rights as a parent. If a man wishes to file a notice of intent to claim paternity of a child, he must do so within 31 days of the date of the birth of the child. For more information, contact the Paternity Registry at:

Request for Address of Grievance

Qualifying and preparing for adoption can be a complicated and emotional experience. Although our program makes every attempt to empower people to make decisions for themselves, there are still many ways in which our clients depend on workers for support and direction. This dependence means that all participants in our program inevitably experience some degree of vulnerability. As a safeguard against potential mistreatment, we offer a grievance process.

Although it is not always possible for workers to accommodate or concur with the wishes of our clients, we believe our clients are entitled to reasonable explanations of decisions made within the program. We believe the people we serve have the right to express their concerns.

If you feel that you have been, in some manner, mistreated by someone connected with Generations Adoptions, or have concerns about particular policies of the program, it is appropriate for you to bring your concerns to the attention of the adoption worker. If that does not relieve your concern, you may bring your issue to the attention of the Agency Director by mailing the attached form to the following address: Director, Generations Adoptions, 400 Schroeder, Waco, Texas 76710.

The agency director will respond to your concern within 7 days. If this does not resolve the issue you may request that the Board of Directors review the situation by sending a written appeal request to the Board. You will receive a written response within 60 working days. By contacting the agency, the current name and address of the Board Chairman will be provided.

Any client may contact the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services with a complaint or grievance against this agency.

Summary of Services to Adoptive Families

The agency provides adoption services to families who meet the screening requirements of the agency. The following services are available:

1. Pre-adoption training through the Orientation and Education meeting.
2. Home studies for families.
3. Facilitation of the adoptive family's relationship with the birth parent(s).
4. Adoptive Family Support Group meetings, as requested, are open to those who are approved by the agency and are awaiting adoptive placement, to those in post-placement supervision, and to those whose adoptions have been finalized.
5. Post adoption services to include
 - a. Post-placement supervision for families.
 - b. Ongoing counseling available to assist with
 1. Bonding
 2. Understanding birth parent(s) grief
 3. Facilitating relationships with birth family
 4. Assisting with adoption issues of the adoptive parents, child, or siblings.

Clarifications

We can not make any guarantees regarding a placement or a timetable. It is dependent upon the birth parent(s) ultimate decisions.

We do not provide children for families, but rather families for children.

There is always a risk of taking a child home before the termination of parental rights and this risk must be considered and weighed prayerfully. This is called a "Legal Risk Adoption."

We can not predict the behavior of birth parents.

We can not predict how the children will "turn out."

We can not predict our own future.

All fees are non-refundable. In the case of an adoption that does not take place because a birthmother chooses to parent, then all fees paid by the prospective adoptive family will apply to the next adoption through Generations Adoptions.

Pass Through Expenses: The above fee schedule is used in lieu of pass through expenses to adoptive families. We have a flat fee schedule and do not pass through expenses.

****Families have the right to have independent legal counsel in any, or all, adoption procedures at their expense, in addition to the agency's fees. Legal fees included in Generations' flat fee include standard relinquishments and notifications of birth parents, paternity registry, and paperwork. Finalization legal fees are NOT included. Families may contract with an adoption attorney that they choose. Should any additional legal issues arise, this will be a cost incurred by the adoptive family should they choose to do so and payable directly to the adoption attorney.**

Adoption Agency Fees, may be reduced or waived in the event of a child with special needs including but not limited to severe physical, emotional, or mental disability. Every effort will be made to place the child in a stable home. The agency may reduce or waive the agency fee entirely or ask that the direct expenses be paid by the couple, such as the attorney and/or medical fees.

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Other Fees:

Subsequent Adoptions: *If an adoptive family seeks to adopt additional children from Generations at a later date, the fee will be set at the current fee schedule as of the date of the second application, less \$1,000.*

Multiple Births: *If an adoptive family adopts twins, triplets, etc. the fees will be as follows:*

First child: \$17,500

Who We Are As An Agency

In an effort to help us understand your beliefs and practices, **we ask that you read the following Statement of Faith carefully and determine if you both are in complete agreement.** In addition we ask that you each complete the Christian Faith Experience questions completely, describing your beliefs and practices. Please return your responses with the pre-application.

Generations Adoptions' Statement of Faith

(Adapted from the National Association of Evangelicals' Statement of Faith)

1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God.
2. We believe that there is one God, eternally existent in three persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal return in power and glory.
4. We believe that for the salvation of lost and sinful men, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential, and that this salvation is received through faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord and not as a result of good works.
